Transformative Improvements to the Pike House!

Through the generosity of Legends Chairman Brent W. Sembler '78, and overseen by the watchful eye of Chapter Advisor Jimmy Keen'73, some \$40,000 in upgrades

and improvements were made to the house this summer.

Jimmy reports, "Legends has invested \$40,000 to improve and renovate our cherished Pike house. The entire first floor including the lobby was sanded down, primed and re-painted, in some areas twice. All light fixtures have been cleaned. The actual view in-person is more striking than photos."




"The new upgraded HD camera system to enhance security and protection for the house should be completely installed at the end of next week."




"Regarding the Pike symbol high on the wall in lobby Pete is going to construct a frame around it to make it appear to be a framed picture."

Alumni: Fall Rush is Coming! If you are a Florida State Pike and your son is






Raymond Anthony Wulf '61 entered

Bill Cheek '61 writes, "Ray was quick to tell you he was in the movie 'Where the Boys Are' with Sandra Dee. The story as he told it was the movie company hired a lot of extras. He was paid to drive his car around and around the block while they were filing the opening scene in Ft Lauderdale. He decided that no one would ever recognize him if he was driving the car so he parked it and made his way to the front of the crowd. When the movie scene in Ft Lauderdale opened a very large crowd was in mass walking across the intersection with Ray leading the crowd. He was very visible.

He was a riot with a quick sense of humor. You may have met him when we had the reunion at the new house several years ago. He had a distinguished career in Probation and Parole."

R.I.P. at 77 Phi Phi Kappa Alpha



Hubert M. Green '65 entered Chapter Eternal on June 19th.

The death threat in the middle of a major PGA tournament shocked the world of professional golf. But Hubert Green's response to it did not surprise Pike alumni who were his contemporaries in Delta Lambda Chapter. "Let's just say Hubert wasn't one to rattle easily," one of Green's pledge brothers from back in the day laughed. "And that's an understatement. He was a pretty hard-core guy; very intense."

Another alumnus agreed, "They had no idea who they were dealing with. The death

threat probably made him double down."

Hubert Green came to Florida State from Birmingham on a golf scholarship and he

intended from the first day to make his living as a professional. His older brother Maurice had been initiated into Gamma Alpha Chapter the year before at the University of Alabama, so Green naturally gravitated toward the Pike house. He grew to be ferociously loyal to Pi Kappa Alpha. In his undergraduate days, men routinely wore jeweled fraternity pins and the most common Pike badges were the relatively inexpensive ones with alternating pearls and garnets. However, Hubert had one made of white gold, the bezel covered all around with green emeralds.

Hubert's affection for his Pike Brothers continued throughout life. Former SMC Matt Raulerson '84 writes, "One day when I was hanging out back of the Wildwood house, Hubert Green came strolling up unannounced. He could not have been more personable and down to earth. How proud he made me to be a Pike!" Sports columnists described him as 'straightforward' and 'plain spoken'. His Pike Brothers would probably use the word 'blunt' when it came to golf. Hubert was always gracious and willing to take Brothers onto the course with him and offer them tips on their game, but his assessments were never couched in false praise. To anyone who felt he was too critical, he'd say, "If you don't want to know, then don't ask."

In the summer of 1966, the 150-pound 19-year-old won the Southern Amateur Championship on his home course at the Country Club of Birmingham. Temperatures broke 100 with no breeze during the four-day tournament, and players were required to take salt pills and receive oxygen from a mobile unit.

Green was a rock, stunning observers with his long distance shots. He told the media, "I'm playing better golf because I played with longer hitters at FSU...and if I can't hit the long ball I'll just have to start caddying for better players."

Back in undergraduate days, fraternity Pledge Masters were generally not selected on the basis of their sensitivity. And so it was with Hubert Green who became a legend in the traditional role. He also served a turn as Kitchen Manager. He was a good salesman too, and a member of the rush committee. Later on, he was responsible for bringing more FSU varsity golfers into the Fraternity.

Green was named the PGA Rookie-of-the-Year in 1971, and then won 11 championships in the next seven seasons.

The legendary death threat and all the drama that surrounded it took place at the U.S. Open in 1977. Sportswriter Todd Miller noted that "Green was the wire-to-wire winner on those steamy fairways."

The FBI received a message that three men were on their way to Southern Hills Country to kill Hubert Green. Specifically, the assassination was to happen on the 15th hole.

It was the first time that all 18 holes of the final round of the U.S. Open were televised.

Tournament officials informed Green and offered him the option of stopping play. Police with long guns and crash helmets surrounded the green. FBI agents infiltrated the gallery.

It will not surprise any of his Delta Lambda contemporaries that after no attempt made on his life on #15, Hubert later said he remembered muttering a contemptuous epithet "Chicken-shit" under his breath.

Hubert Green scored par on #15 without a hitch. His final round 70 gave him the 1977 Open Championship.

Hubert Green's 26 seasons on Tour amassed 19 tour victories including both the

U.S. Open and the PGA Championship, 3 Ryder Cup wins, 2 championships in Japan and another in Europe.

He was inducted into the prestigious World Golf Hall of Fame in 2008.

As proud as he was of his golf skills, he was just as reticent to publically reveal the true depth of his philanthropic heart. He participated in hundreds of charity tournaments and community fund-raising initiatives for a wide range of causes, especially childhood diseases.

Brother Hubert Green succumbed on June 19th after a long battle with throat cancer.
